

# Collision Core Return Program



## Lighting and Fascia Core Return

1. Determine if the replacement part has a core charge. Parts that have a yellow core deposit notification label must be returned to your selling Ford or Lincoln Dealer.
2. Locate the blue Ford part number label on the packaging of the new light or fascia and cut the entire label off and tape it to the the damaged part with clear tape.
3. Return the the old damaged light or fascia to your selling Ford or Lincoln Dealer for a refund of the core charge.



## Wheel Core Return

1. Determine if the replacement part has a core charge. Parts that have a yellow core deposit notification label must be returned to your selling Ford or Lincoln Dealer.
2. Place the old, damaged wheel in the box the new replacement wheel came in and return to your selling Ford or Lincoln Dealer for a refund of the core charge.



Ford recycles, reuses and reprocesses the parts removed during servicing—such as headlights and bumper fascias—which are broken down into small pellets and used to make new parts.
